## Burgschänke Kaiserslautern

Though you're probably accustomed to cooking and carving a giant Butterball, roasted goose is Germany's much-loved bird. This year, try Christmas like the locals, and you'll discover that *Weihnachtsgans* is juicier and retains more flavors than the typical turkey. At the Burgschänke, delicious goose is available daily until Christmas and accompanied by dumplings, red cabbage and chestnuts.

The Burgschänke kitchen also serves a Christmas Day feast. At deadline, the 2014 bill of fare had not been finalized, but last year's spread was three courses: mushroom soup, each guest's pick from eight entrées, and wine-soaked plums with gingerbread whipped topping. Children's plates were also offered.

The quaint half-timbered restaurant is open every day of the month, except Dec. 24. Advance bookings are highly recommended, necessary for groups of eight or more. Visit www.burgschaenke-kl.de for contact information, directions and opening hours.



## Hotel Rosenhof Ramstein

Hotel Rosenhof provides numerous dishes and promotions in December. Spice up your week at the surprise three-course dinners on Mondays, or choose one of three holiday-themed set menus available Dec. 1-23. Observe Advent during the buffet lunch on Dec. 14, featuring chestnut soup, appetizers, slow-cooked beef, peanutcrusted chicken, traditional stollen and more. Plus, the evenings of Dec. 3, 10 and 17, bring your coworkers to sip Glühwein and peruse smorgasbords of starters, mains and sweet treats.

If prepping, cooking and cleaning is not how you plan to spend the holiday, arrive between 11:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Dec. 24-25 for a family- and budget-friendly buffet; children under 6 eat for free, and children 6-12 eat for half price. ## Zum Kääser Erzenhausen

From now to Dec. 30, gather a group to eat Zum Kääser's *Gans* banquet. I've been the past two years and can assure you it's yummy! After steamy soup (pumpkin cream both times I've visited) and fresh salad, a chestnut-stuffed goose is carved tableside. Cabbage and *Knödel* are also presented family style. To have this house favorite, you must notify the restaurant several days prior.
